Last summer was a historic summer for Camp Ramah. Bringing Jewish kids, young adults, and adults together in an immersive Jewish bubble was what we all needed. The community and sense of belonging were palpable. Campers and staff alike shared that they were able to breathe deeply and not worry about speaking openly about their Jewish identity with pride. We welcomed over 70 campers and over 30 young adults from Israel, most of whom came straight from their army or national service in Israel to spend the summer with us. As you can imagine, this was such a gift for our American and Israeli campers and for our staff. We were all enriched by this *mifgash* (connection and gathering).

We are so proud to see, in so many ways, that Ramah continues to live up to our own high expectations and mission-driven values to create a sense of belonging, connection, Jewish identity, community, and more, all while playing in our giant Jewish playground. The values that came to life so vividly last summer are mirrored in the reflections we received from parents, campers, and staff.




